A View From the Deacon's Seat

Divine Mercy Sunday

Then he (Jesus) said to him (the leper), "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them." The (leper) went away and began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

Mark 1:44-45

If you have small children, you may be familiar with "the look." As a parent, you want what is best for your child. This includes some amount of discipline. If you see your child doing something unsafe, you try and correct the unsafe behavior. However, if the child does not want to stop what they are doing, they may well cross their arms and give you a look that says (loudly), I want what I want and hang the consequences. For most young children, obedience is not high on their 'to do' list. Yet, as parents, discipline must be on our 'to do' list. We have all seen or heard about children that have never experienced discipline. I believe our jails are filled with these individuals.

Now, Jesus is known for his healings. In his ministry, Jesus healed folks even if it meant he would be ostracized for doing this. One of the main charges against him before his crucifixion was that he healed a person on the Sabbath. In this passage, Jesus is filled with compassion and heals a man with leprosy. Yet there is an admonition given to this person as well. Jesus tells the man to not tell anyone he has been healed. The fellow is asked to obey Jesus. The word "obey" has developed a negative connotation, especially in modern times. When we are called to obey someone, we are sometimes offended. But "obey" comes from a Latin word which means to listen to. For example, when we obey the Lord, we listen to Him and what the heart of Jesus desires. Jesus asks the leper to obey. He says, "Do not tell anyone about this." And what does the leper do? He disobeys. And so the result is that Jesus is pushed out of the town and has to go into a deserted place. That's exactly what happens when we do not listen to the Lord. We push Christ out of our hearts and into a deserted place. When we obey, we listen to the Lord and bring Him close. He is the source of our joy. He's the source of our freedom. Disobedience ostracizes. Obedience unites.
