A View From the Deacon's Seat

4th Sunday of Easter

"If you ate only one meal a week would you survive? It is the same for your soul. Nourish it with the Blessed Sacrament."

-St. Andre Bessette

Born in Canada, St Andre (1845-1937) was dogged by sickness and weakness from birth. Orphaned at the age of 12, he became a farmhand. Over the next few years he had many occupations, including being a factory worker in the United States during the Civil War. At 25, André applied for entrance into the Congregation of Holy Cross in Montreal but was not admitted because of his poor health. With his bishop's permission, he was finally received and was given the humble job of doorkeeper at Notre Dame College in Montreal, with additional duties as sacristan, laundry worker and messenger. "When I joined this community, the superiors showed me the door, and I remained 40 years," he said. St. Andre had a profound devotion to St. Joseph. When an epidemic broke out at a nearby college, André volunteered to nurse. Not one person died. The trickle of sick people to his door became a flood. His superiors were uneasy; diocesan authorities were suspicious; doctors called him a quack. "I do not cure," he said again and again. "Saint Joseph cures." In the end he needed four secretaries to handle the 80,000 letters he received each year.

Jesus calls each of us to become saints. I tell myself this over and over again. On rare occasions, I start to believe it may be possible for me to achieve this. Then I look in the mirror and see a fallen and sinful man looking back at me. St. Andre is a person who is literally shouting something very different to all of us. The road to sainthood began for St. Andre by standing at the door and opening it to others, by preparing for and attending mass, by washing other people's clothes, by scurrying down hallways to deliver messages. Most of all, St. Andre became a saint by helping others and constantly praying for them. Others around him were suspicious and could not fathom his ability to help others because they were unwilling to do what he did; to constantly pray and to put the needs of others before their own needs.

Jesus commanded us: "Be holy as your heavenly Father is holy." (Mt. 5:48) I fear that too many of us believe we must become martyrs to be saints. St. Andre is a reminder to every one of us that becoming a saint is not a lofty goal that is completely out of our reach. God knows us in ways we do not know ourselves. God has given each of us the ability to be saints. Will you hold the door for someone?
