# A View From the Deacon's Seat

5th Sunday of Easter

Galadriel: "Mithrandir, why the halfling?"

Gandalf: "I don't know. Saruman believes it is only great powers that can hold evil in check. But that is not what I have found. I have found that it is the small everyday deed of ordinary folks that keep the darkness at bay. Simple acts of kindness and love. Why Bilbo Baggins? Perhaps because I am afraid, and he gives me courage."

J.R.R. Tolkien – The Hobbit

For those of you who do not know, I am a huge fan of J.R.R. Tolkien. Mr. Tolkien was a writer of some of the most famous fantasy novels ever written: The Hobbit and The Lord of the Rings. What makes his novels even more intriguing is that they have an underlying theme of Christianity, especially the Catholic faith. Tolkien served in the First World War and fought in some of the most horrific battles of that war. His experiences left him with a profound faith, and he was particularly drawn to the Blessed Sacrament. It was his influence that convinced C.S. Lewis to become a Christian after being an atheist most of his life.

The above excerpt from The Hobbit is a case in point. For those who do not understand, allow me to explain. In the novel, Galadriel is an elven princess. Mithrandir (also known as Gandalf) is a wizard fighting the evil forces. Saruman is an evil wizard, but he pretends to be on the side of good. Bilbo is a halfling, a person of small stature and in worldly terms, of small importance.

I believe that because Tolkien fought in such terrible battles that were always completely out of his control, he began to see the world as Gandalf describes. The great powers believe that only they can have influence. Those in the trenches see clearly that the small deeds of love and kindness are what make life have any meaning.

This is so very true today. So many things appear to be outside of our control. It is easy to give up hope and give in to despair. The same was true in Jesus' day. Jesus lived in an insignificant corner of the greatest empire the world had known. He certainly did not influence Caesar or great military leaders. He lived a simple life of gentleness and kindness. Even in his own country, he was mocked and despised. Yet it is his name that is before every other name and his name that every knee bows to.

Sometimes our actions may not appear to have any influence upon the world. Yet it is often our small actions that can make the lives of those around us have meaning. How have you changed the world today by your small everyday deeds?

VISIT THE CATHEDRAL IN SPRINGFIELD OR SS. PETER PAUL CHURCH IN ALTON, RECEIVE INDULGENCE! - Bishop Thomas John Paprocki received permission from the Holy See, granting a plenary indulgence to those who make a pilgrimage to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield or Ss. Peter and Paul Church in Alton (the "Old Cathedral") now through December 8. One must also partake in the other usual conditions to receive this indulgence by going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and saying prayers for the intention of the Pope. These acts "may be carried out several days preceding or following the performance of the prescribed works. But it is more fitting that communion and the prayer for the pope's intentions take place on the day the work is performed" (Handbook of Indulgences, Norms for Indulgences, 23.3). An indulgence a gift and grace that remits the temporal punishment due to a sin.
