A View From the Deacon's Seat

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"We will never be free of trials and temptations as long as our earthly life lasts. For Job has said: 'Is not the life of human beings on earth a drudgery?' (Job 7:1). Therefore, we should always be on our guard against temptations, always praying that our enemy, the devil, 'who never sleeps but constantly looks for someone to devour.' (1 Pet 5:8), will not catch us off guard. No one in this world is so perfect or holy as not to have temptations sometimes."

Today's first reading is fearsome to comprehend:

"Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the flock of my pasture, says the Lord. Therefore, thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, against the shepherds who shepherd my people: You have scattered my sheep and driven them away. You have not cared for them, but I will take care to punish your evil deeds." Jer. 23:1-2

The last thing I want to hear is that God will hold me accountable for my deeds. Now, many folks will say that Jeremiah is from the Old Testament and Jesus is not the terrifying God of the Old Testament. My response is that Jesus said that he came not to change a single word of the Old Testament. We all want to change God into our own image and thus, make God more palatable. Jesus promises mercy, and I depend so very much on his mercy. Sadly, I far too often forget (and choose to do so) that Jesus often rebuked those who sinned. He forgave the woman caught in adultery, but admonished her to "go and sin no more."

There is both good news and bad news here. The good news is that Jesus and his Church eagerly want to help us overcome sin. The best way is to make frequent confessions and receive the Eucharist. The bad news is that no Christian faith says that Jesus gives a free pass to anyone.

The Thomas á Kempis quote is from a book entitled, "The Imitation of Christ" written in the early 1400's. It became and remains one of the most influential spiritual books ever written. I was drawn to this quote because it correctly states that no one is ever free of temptation. It is something each of us faces. Yet in his book, Thomas á Kempis explains that all of us are able to overcome these trials and temptations if we place our trust in Christ Jesus. Will you trust Jesus today?

PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES - July 10, 2024

Members Present:

PRAYER:

• Opening prayer was led by Fr. Michael.

FORMATION

- Sarah reported that registration for Faith Formation will be August 3 & 4. Registration forms are available online and will be included in the St. Charles and Newman bulletins. The curriculum will be the same as last year.
 - A pancake breakfast is scheduled for September 8th, and classes will begin the following week (September 15).
- Joe Porter provided a summary of his ongoing efforts to update the church census so Father Michael would come to know the purpose and progression thus far of this effort. Council discussed next steps, one of which will be to follow up with people who have filled out new member cards. It was suggested that the incoming Director of Evangelization and Discipleship would be the appropriate person to make the initial call to new members to welcome them and help them register. Father Michael will also meet with new members.

There was discussion about having all Council members help Joe to identify deceased parishioners, as well as those who have moved away, so they can be filtered out of the St. Charles database.

• August 1st is the start date for the Director of Evangelization and Discipleship, Thomas Gallagher.

HOSPITALITY

• August is the final month that St. Charles will have doughnuts after the first Sunday 8:30 Mass. Council considered whether to continue doughnut receptions after August. The concern is how to ensure faith formation students get to class on time, while also allowing them to have a doughnut. There was also conversation about how to allocate the responsibilities of hosting and clean-up if St. Charles schedules year round first Sunday receptions.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS

• Only seven people have signed up for the July 20th bus trip to Indianapolis, so St. Charles might need to cancel the bus. Father Michael will ask Father John if Mattoon's Immaculate Conception Parish has a bus going, and if they could accommodate the seven from St. Charles.
